- A way of life or style of living that reflects the attitudes and values of a person or a group.

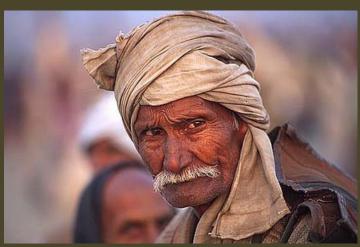

What is Lifestyle product?

- Lifestyle product depends on an individual's choice and what he chooses to buy.
- Not strictly utilitarian but objects to derive pleasure.
- Function does not over power all other needs.
- Esteemed value, projection of owner's attitude and sometimes his social status.
- Niche marketing, niche design

Lifestyle product – a status symbol at an affordable price.





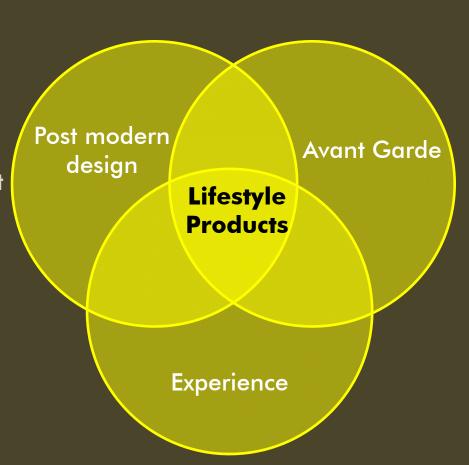


How did it start?

- Post-Second World War Use and throw attitude
- Competitive economy
- Mass production at relatively cheaper rate
- 'Best' defined by the consumer and not by
 producer as more than simply cheap experience
- It also includes value for money,
 reliability and service.
- Production of consumer durables that have quality and can perform at levels *much higher than basic* necessity.

Kitchen products













A blender or liquidiser or grinder

- -Motor capacity 500 W to 750 W
- -3 speed options
- -Air vent at bottom and top.
- -Proper ventilation, enough circulation space –

No top vents

- Reduces the maximum operating time of the motor.







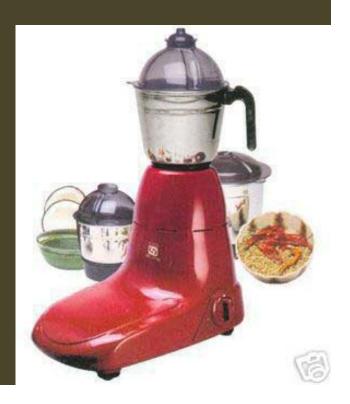
Narrow base

- -Motor without any extra space.
- International players like Philips, Morphy Richards, etc.
- Perceived as compact mixer grinders superior, technically advanced and hence costly.
- Less space for storage.



Broad base

- -Motor with a platform in the front.
- -Local players like Maharaja, Jaipan, Sumeet, etc.
- Perceived as sturdy, heavy duty and reliable



- 3 containers of different sizes for different purposes.
- -0.35 to 0.6 Ltr Dry grinding, Chutney making
- -0.75 to 1.0 Ltr Grinding for bigger quantities
- -1.2 to 1.5 Ltr For liquids
- -Local manufacturers in Southern part provide dry grinding jars of upto 0.6 Ltr capacity as spices and chutneys are made in large quantities.
- -Similarly, in Northern part, the liquidizing jar of upto 1.5 Ltr capacity is provided which is used for making buttermilk, lassi, etc.

Transparent plastic jars - clean look, rich feel, better interaction

Not preferred

Transparent lids for better visibility.

- -Not much difference in terms of features.
- -Cost variation Mainly due to motor power, materials used and brand name associated with the product.

Mixers

- -Hand mixer a hand-held mixing device.
- -Typically consists of a handle mounted over a large enclosure containing motor, which drives one or two beaters.



-Stand mixer - essentially same as a hand mixer, but is mounted on a stand which bears the weight of the device.
-Larger and more powerful motor.



A blender or liquidiser or grinder or Mixie

-Stationary, upright electrical device used to mix ingredients or puree food.

Mixer

-A kitchen appliance intended for mixing, beating and whipping food ingredients.

Blenders contain sharp blades and typically operate at higher speeds that chop, liquefy, or otherwise break down larger food items. A mixer is a much slower device without blades.

Toaster

- A toaster works by applying radiant heat directly to a bread slice.
- Usually two or four bread toasters are available.
- Manual, semi automatic and automatic (Pop up) toasters.

- -Combination of subtle and striking colors

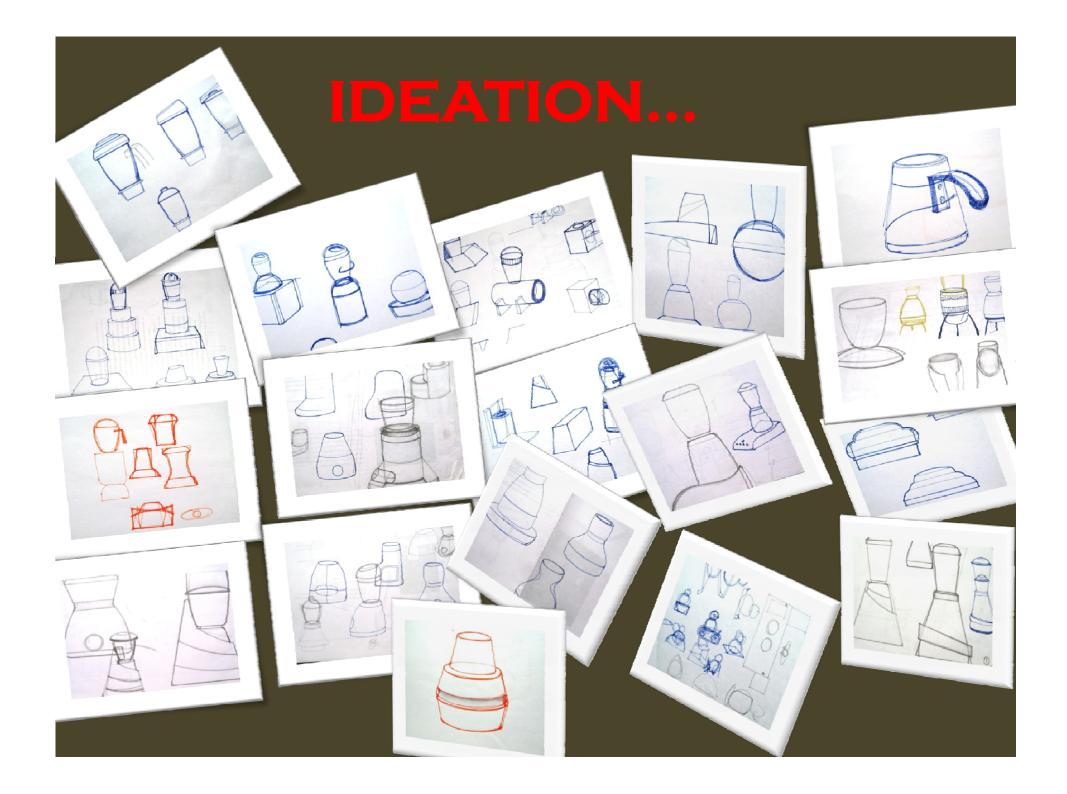

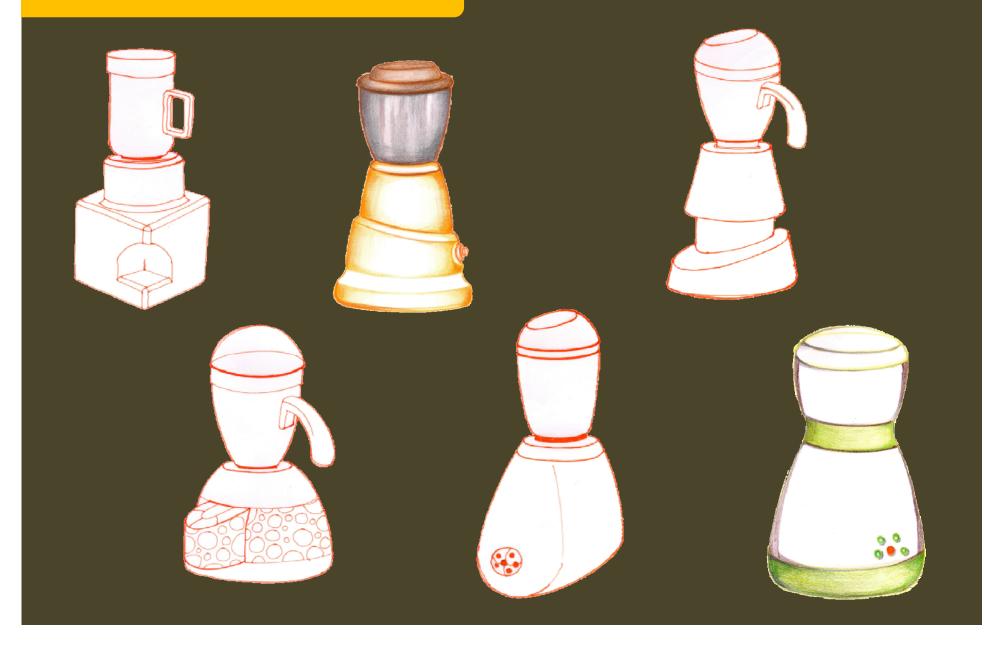


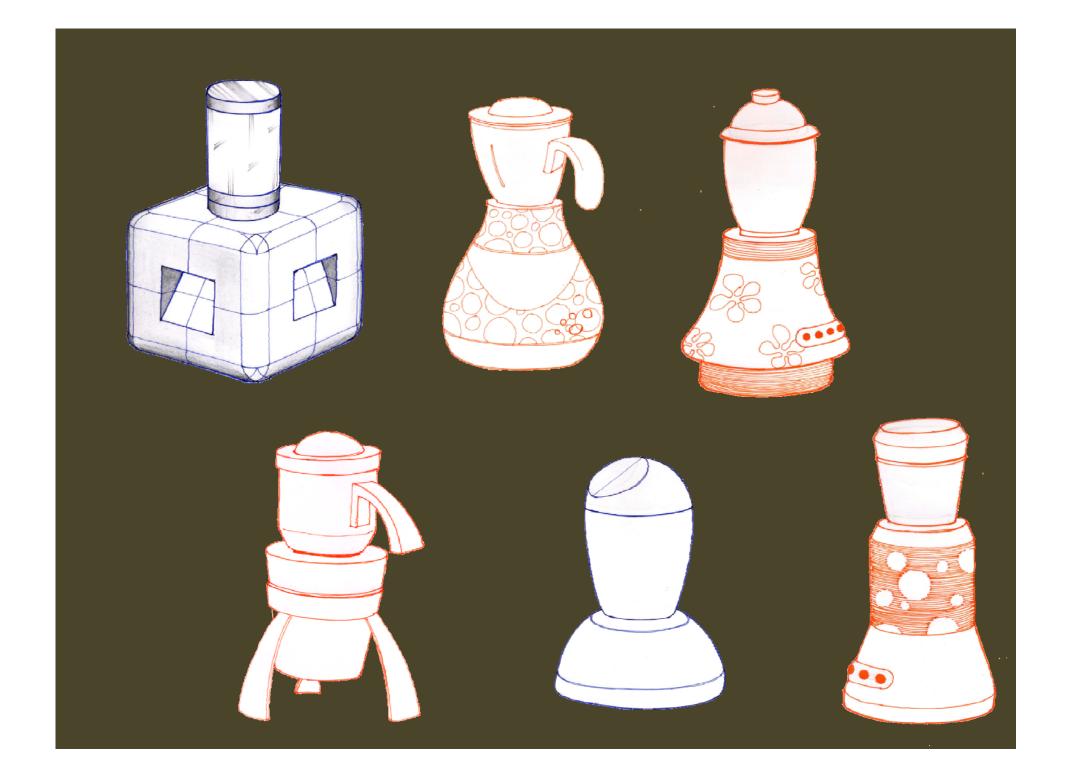






Cluster 2 Narrow base

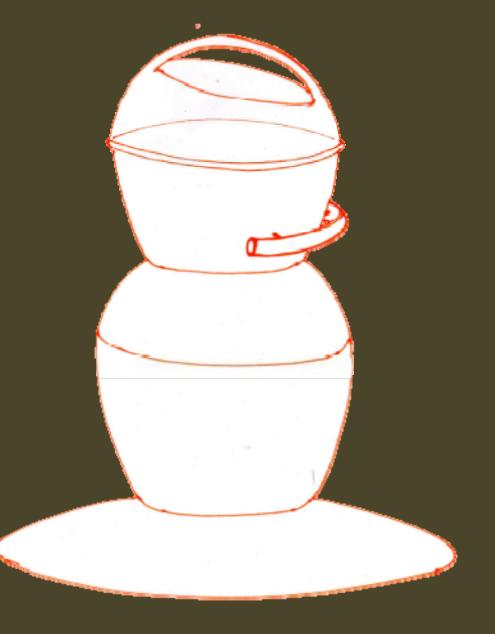




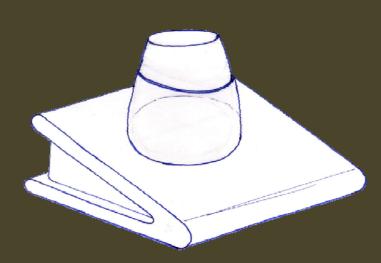


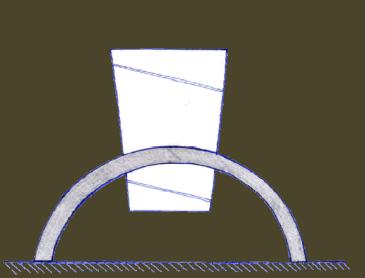


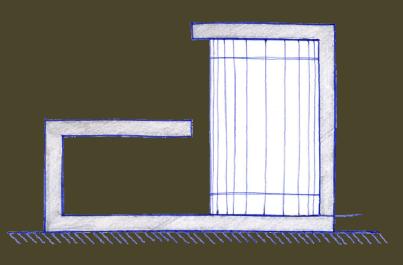

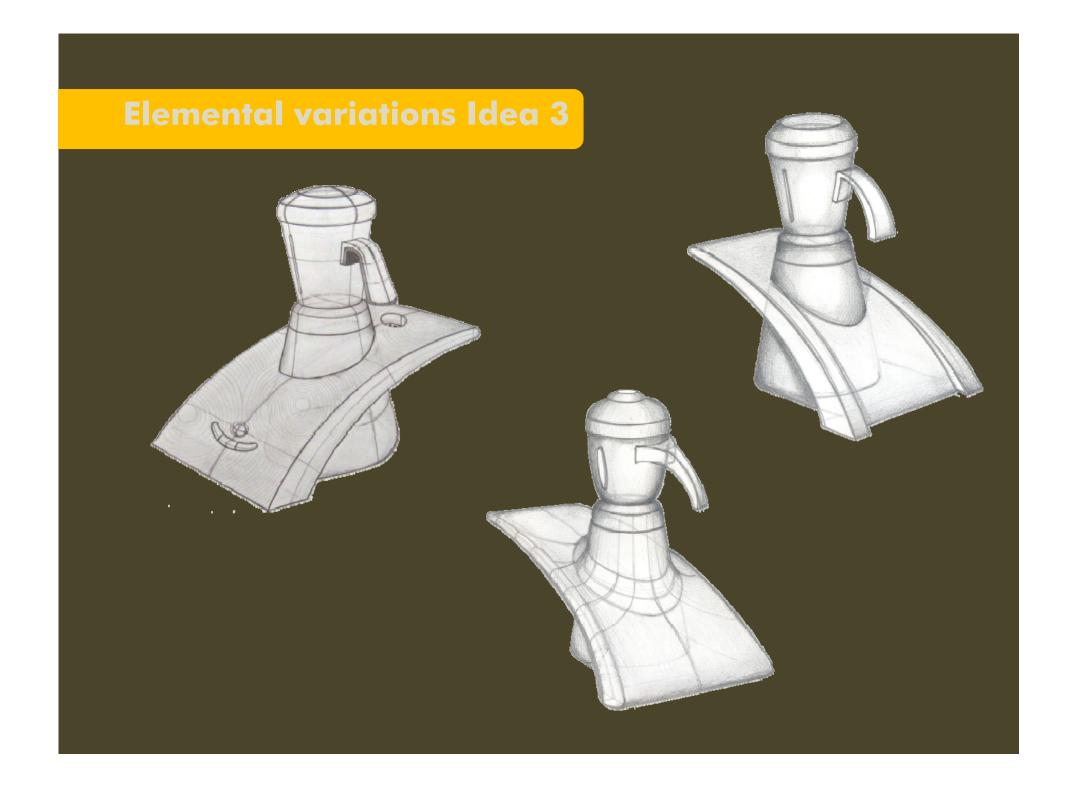

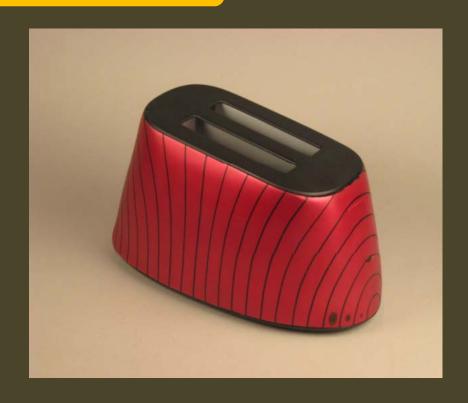


Final products – Mixer grinder



- -Slightly taller than existing ones for differentiation
- -Separate cap To complete the form when not in use Show piece
- -Handle of jars Inclined circular rings with elliptical section Easy to hold, lift and tilt
- -Lid of the jars Transparent with inclined plane Better interaction –Visibility and orientation
- -Special depressions as handles
- -Retractable mechanism for wire
- -Control switches with backlight LEDs

Toaster



- -Form transforming from ellipse to rectangle
- -Large radii at the bottom Visually light
- -Slope at the top Holding area for the toast – No exposure to local environment
- -Control buttons with backlight LEDs
- -Avante garde but not too far away from existing image of toasters.

Hand blender



- -Smallest part of the family Single piece element
- -Depression for control button Better grip and control
- -Slope on top LED Better visibility
- -Special wall mounting hood Houses the power cord when not in use
