





Not very keen on experimenting and trying out new designs


Field Study

The consumers

- -Tourists, localites, organizations, hotels etc.
- -Local people buy products for their daily use or for gifting as per the traditions.
- -Tourists buy products to cherish the memories of Kashmir or for the value of handmade products which are unique unlike the industrial products.

Tertiary users

- -Shop keepers, logistics
- -Shop keepers are affected by the chinese and machine made products.
- -Lack of optimization in usage of materials results into heavy products.
- -Ease of packaging and transporting are normally not considered.



The issues



- -Limited exposure to emerging trends in markets and affects the sale of product outside.
- -The role of middlemen and the unorganized sector affects the artisans.
- -Unavailability of material and other manufacturing processes.
- -Lack of innovation resulted into loss of market space for some trade.

Design directions

Design interventions for new products based on the latest trends.

Initiate collaboration between different trades for new products and thereby eliminating the possibility of any trade getting extinct.

To design an innovative business model to ensure artisans are benefitted for their effort and to eliminate the bad trade practices prevalent in the current scenario.

To design and develop products to enhance the skill of artisans in exploring new forms and materials.

To develop methods for artisans to collaborate with designers at ease and develop new products by working as a team.

Design Objective

Design a range of luminaires and expose artisans to new forms, contemporary designs and new materials and assist them in catching up with the emerging market.

Market Study for luminaires

The range of luminaires from Kashmiri handicraft sector is very less due to the unavailability of electrical fittings and also due to the reluctance of artisans to explore new areas.









Design brief


Design products which can enhance the skills of craftsman.

Try to develop a market for Kashmiri handicrafts based luminaires.


To learn and apply the limits in hand crafting as a part of the design.


