Abstract

Mr. S. D. Phadnis is a renowned cartoonist and an illustrator, working for almost six decades. He has carved a niche for himself in the field of humorous illustrations. The simplicity in his work brings out the humor in the day-to-day life.

His outstanding illustrations in the Maths textbooks (1st/2nd std) for school children, introduced me to the splendid art of illustrations at a very early age. His illustrations made learning Maths more fun and easy.

Thanks to my documentary film project, for my Masters, I got an opportunity to meet him personally and understand his perspective towards work.

Objective Part I

The primary objective of this project is:

Create a documentary film, on Mr. S. D. Phadnis and his immaculate work of cartoons and illustration.

Understanding the basics of filmmaking

Why this subject?

Since childhood, I was inspired by the work of Mr. Phadnis. Sharing and presenting the experiences of Mr. Phadnis's journey as an artist, who created a distinct identity through his style of work and through his personality, is the goal of this project.

Mr. Phadnis, who is working for almost six decades now, has a rich experience of how changes in the society, human behavior, mentality, technology of printing can affect art. His work brings out simplistic humor, from the middle class life, which might not be noticed otherwise.

Also, there isn't any documentary, existing on his work, so working on an untouched subject, was quite thrilling for me.

Shivram Dattatreya Phadnis, fondly known as S.D. Phadnis hails from Belgum district, Karnataka, India. He was born on July 29th 1925 at Bhoj, a small village near Belgum. A few years after his birth, the family shifted to Kolhapur where he did his schooling. He got his formal training in painting from the J. J. School of arts in Mumbai. Here, he started cartooning for fun, but his work was so good that editors of 'Huns' publication gave him an opportunity to publish it, and the readers loved it, thus eventually cartooning became his career.

Encounter with humour

In his college years, Walt Disney and Norman Rockwell were his inspiration. Rockwell depicted day-to-day life scenarios, which was mostly published, in the 'Saturday Evening Post'. Amongst the Indian artists, K. Shankar Pillai known for 'Shankar's weekly' was one of his favorites.

Mr. Phadnis developed his art, on his own observations, as cartooning was not a part of the syllabus and there can't be a specific formula to create humor.



SD Phadnis's work



As the saying goes 'Pictures speaks a thousand words', is very true in his case, since, for his humorous illustrations, he never took support of captions. His ideas were visual ideas depicted through lines and colors. Hence, his illustrations were appreciated by all, surpassing all boundaries of language, religion and region. He believes 'Cartoon' is a media of communication, which is as highly interactive, fast and versatile. He excels in portraying the complexities of everyday life with a dash of humor.

Phadnis tried experimenting in political cartoons, but it didn't work out, he rather preferred to endeavor happiness through his humors illustrations.

He has preserved all his artworks, after the printing process, and made them accessible to the new generation by transferring them into the digital media for exhibitions and sale.

Work for Huns publication



'Mohini' magazine cover published in 1952, which made huge impact on readers. This illustration is redesigned on same concept. Mr. Phadnis created illustrations for 'Huns' Publications Magazine, 'Mohini' in 1951 and in the following year, did the cover illustration for 'Mohini'.

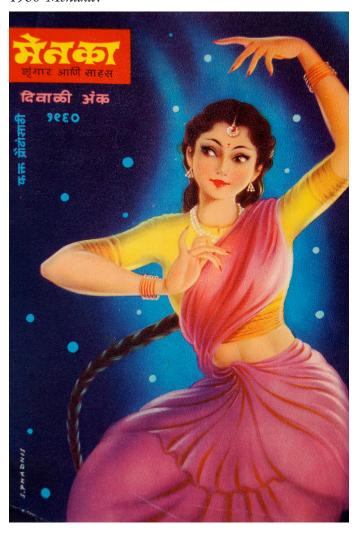
'Mohini' is an annual Marathi magazine catered to woman. Marathi magazines in those times depicted women in a realistic and serious manners, humors illustrations were a complete no no. Hence, it was an image make-over that the magazine had to go through. It was a major challenge for Mr. Phadnis to avoid disappointment of the existing readers, and also for the publisher Mr. Antarkar, not to loose business. But Mr. Antatkar trusted Mr. Phadnis and his work, and the make-over of 'Mohini' was appreciated by all and it also increased the readership of the magazine.

This success encouraged Mr. Phadnis, to shift from Kolhapur to Pune, which was an emerging market for the publication business.

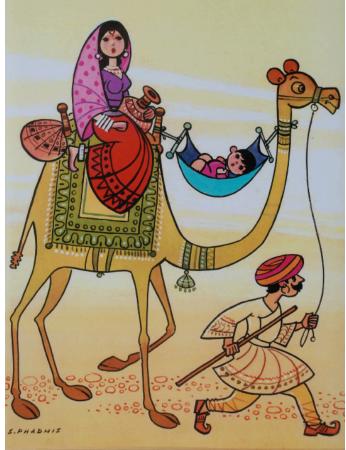


This magazine cover Bagged 'Outstanding Editorial Art Award' by Commercial Artist's Guild (CAG), Mumbai in 1954.

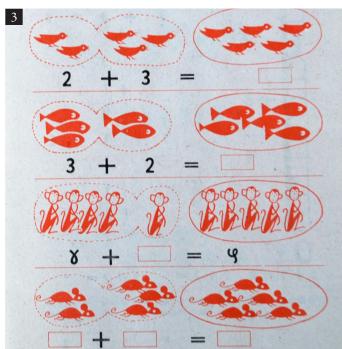
Maths books

His contribution in redesigning, the Math's book for the first and second standard students was a turning point for the education system.

The challenge was, 'Math's' a complex, and boring subject for many, had to be made simple and interesting for students from the start. He excelled in this challenge, without tampering the subject matter. His imagination and abstraction of numeric values helped in simplifying it, making students friendly with math. He developed a common design language that any child irrespective of his/her background can understand.

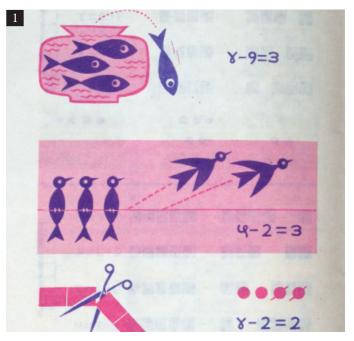

Prabhavalkar and other. These people known for their hilarious writing. Mr. Phadnis interpreted that humour in his illustrations.

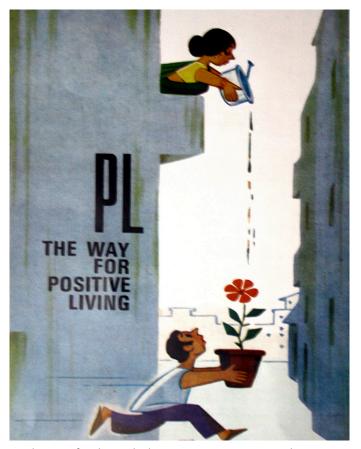


Book cover of 'Sudamyache pohe'.

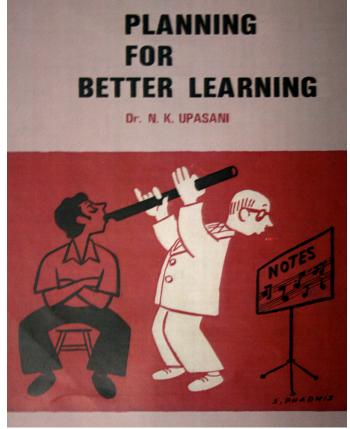


Book cover of 'Smile please'.

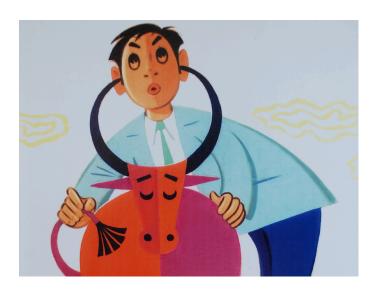

Identity_{through} style



His captions less illustrations have traveled the world crossing all boundaries. The simplification, innocence, composition of characters, usage of bright colors and rhythmic lines makes his illustrations attractive, they bring out the subtle emotions in a form of humor from our day-to-day life. His visuals emerge through observations of the human behavior.

One can see the variation in his style, with the touch of realistic rendering. Mr. Phadnis is very prolific and one of the few illustrators who excelled in humor illustrations and did most of his works for Hans Publication.

His illustrations managed to capture the nuance of the local Maharashtrian culture, his work echoed the transition that the typical maharashtrian middle class attitude was going though. It was this time, when the eminent writers like, C.V. Joshi, P.K. Atre and P.L. Deshpande were on their peak in creating humouros literature, based on the integrity of the middle class. Mr. Phadnis, was the only artist during that time contributing through visual imagery. Though created in the 50s and 80s, his illustrations are still able to connect with today's globalised world.

His first exhibition of selected original multicolored pictures, 'Laughing Gallery' was held at Jahangir Art Gallery, Mumbai in 1965. He got an overwhelming response for his first exhibition, which resulted into 47 more exhibitions in last sixty years all over India.

'Laughing Gallery' traveled across the India from cities to small town without the language barrier. It even traveled abroad, including seven stops at South San Francisco, Arizona, New York, Cincinnati, Miami, Florida and London. He accomplished a power, to connect with people, through his humorous illustrations.

Last exhibition of 'Laughing Gallery' was held in, 'Maratha mandir Belgaum art circle', Belgaum in 2009.

He then went ahead and published his first book 'Laughing Gallery' with selected color pictures in 1970. Its 4th edition was printed in 2005.

Chitrahas Demonstration and slide sho

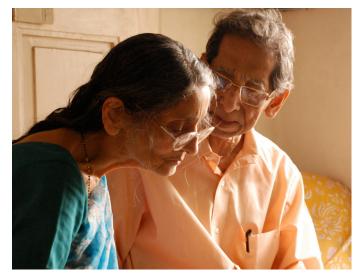


'Chitrahas' is a show, conducted by Mr. Phadnis, where he shares his views about humorous illustrations and cartooning, followed by a 90 minutes interactive demonstration where spectators get to see how a cartoon is born. Demonstration involves some of his favorite cartoons, where he follows specific steps, to reveal the gag in the end. He has conducted almost, 70 'Chitrahas' shows all over India.

My experience of 'Chitrahas':

I attended and captured the footage of 'Chitrahas' show conducted in Shrirampur on 19th march 2010. Shrirampur, near Ahmednagar, Maharashtra, is very small town; the show was arranged in small cinema theater, after the matinee film show was over. The inconvenience in arrangement, didn't impact his enthusiasm at all, Mr. Phadnis, himself started arranging the board and projector. His demonstration had a magic charm, and made the viewers spellbound. His down to earth approach, and the enthusiasm, helps connecting with audience, and forces them to think about the secret behind that energy at the age of 85.

He has two daughters, Leena and Roopa. Roopa helps him in making his work, digital friendly, and accessible to the new generation.

Along with close publications, he is still working to take humourous illustrations to new heights.

Film and structure

While doing this research, other than the subject itself, I tried my hand at different techniques one of it being 'animated documentary films'. In animated films, artificial characters and surrounding can depict the actual look and feel of a character or situation. One of it's, advantage is that you can blend old footage with the new ones very well, it's very similar to a biographical film.

In my project I have tried to apply my learnings in animation (motion graphical animation), along with actual footage of the exhibition journey, his interviews, newspapers articles, past events to make it interesting.

The basic visual elements in my film are, the demonstrations given by Mr. Phadnis, old photographs of his exhibition, illustrations for 'Mohini' magazine, illustrations from the exhibits, old footage from the UGC program, old printed covers of other publications and newspaper cutouts.

Concept

Every film has it own structure; it has a beginning, middle and an end. The purpose of making this film is a humble attempt to share, my leanings about Mr. Phadnis.

Concept 1:

The approach behind 1st concept of the film is portraying his daily routine, simple things like earlymorning tea with newspaper; daily walks which leads to details of his work, exhibition, ending on a good note of family support. In this concept I want to show his present daily life with the help of 'Vivadha bharati' songs as a major part of background score.

Concept 2:

The approach behind 2nd concept is to make film more humorous; it starts with the 'laughing club', which tries to bring happiness in today's hectic life, and then unfolds itself with Mr. Phadnis's illustrations based on the day-to-day humour. Comparing the fun achieved in the 'laughing club' with Mr. Phadnis's illustrations work, which also share same magic in different way. It also simultaneously unfolds the details of his work, including same visual material in above concept.

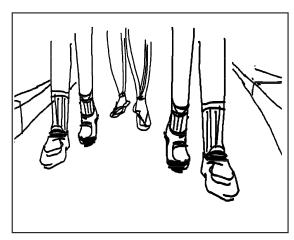
It ends with testimonials of artists and cartoonists about his working style, ethics, and dedication in humorous illustrations.

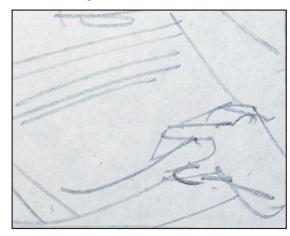

Interview with S.D.Phadnis

My experiance with Mr. Padnis.

Mr. Phadnis adheres to his schedules and appointments. He notes the smallest "to do" thing in his planner. It helps him to be very punctual. In the initial meetings and conversations he was more formal and reserved. He took a few meetings to open up, as previous interviewers only asked about his work and his journey towards it. After knowing details of my project, he took more personal interest in the process of it with generous curiosity.

In the first meeting we discussed about his 'Laughing gallery' book, published in 1970. He explained how the printing process was improved till the 4th edition of his book. Initially they worked with block printing, and then to two-color printing, four-color printing. He still has some blocks, which he cleaned and pasted on his front door.

He told me about his childhood in belgaum, where he used to made small Ganpati idols for fun. Later they moved to Kolhapur for the schooling. His joint family and uncles took care of him after his father's untimely demise. His interest in drawing was nourished by the active art surrounding in Kolhapur. Later he joined Sir J. J. School of arts Bombay in 1946. His tryst with cartoons and humour illustration was totally unplanned. He went back to Kolhapur to work for a printing press.

Mr. Anant Antarkar publisher of 'Huns' asked Mr. Phadnis to work for him for magazine covers and other illustrations from Kolhapur. They worked for few years. Meanwhile Mr. Phadnis also worked with advertising agencies for illustrations. Later Mr. Anant Antarkar asked him to come to Pune and work for 'Huns' regularly. He wasn't sure about this opportunity, so he continued working with advertising agencies. But the response from readers made him leave other commercial work.

He kept on developing his style and process of ideation which became his signature.

After collecting all his work through these years he exhibited them in Jehangir art gallery Bombay in 1965. It was new experiment for him, as art galleries were mostly unnoticed by common people. But he got a good response from the crowd; people came from Girgoan to Dombiwali to see his work. This response gave him the confidence to do more exhibitions. While arranging exhibitions in many cities, he faced major problems in transportation of his heavy luggage and no proper arrangement in art galleries to display exhibits properly. So he designed the folding display holder. It was made up of few iron roads and plain white cloths having pockets to put exhibits in it. This new holder was light in weight and comfortable to carry. He enjoyed the process to made this satisfying product.

In his exhibitions the audience often asked him to give demonstrations. So he started his Chitrahas program, which is a demonstration with slideshow of his work. Both these activities and his constant work in humour illustration helped him to receive tremendous love, appreciation and great respect from people.

One visitor in his exhibition asked him to exhibit Laughing galley in Mysore, Karnataka. This exhibition made him realize the unbound imagery he created which surpassed all boundaries and captions to reach the viewers. Concepts generated from daily routine events are the soul of his work and brought him close to viewers.

Interview 1: Mr. Anand Antarkar

Mr. Anand Antarkar is son of Late, Mr. Anant Antarkar, the publisher of "Huns" publication who gave Mr. Phadnis his first break, as a humor illustrator and supported him through out his career. Mr. Antarkar is working with Mr. Phadnis from last 40 year after his father's untimely demise. He admires Mr. Phadnis, for his professionalism as an artist and his punctuality. He also talked about how 'Huns' publication moved from Bombay to Pune. The sudden change in identity of 'Mohini' caused negative impact on viewership, still his father stuck to his decision to go ahead with Mr. Phadnis's humour illustrations for magazine cover.

Mr. Phadnis's cartoons and illustrations inspired these childhood friends to create the character 'Chintu', and hence they made it a point to have their first edition of 'Chintu comic book', inaugurated by Mr. Phadnis.

They also respect him for his work in copyrights issues in early 60s. It shows Mr. Phadnis's professionalism and respect for his artwork. At that time, Mr. Phadnis was one of the few artist who were aware of whole copyrights issue.

Yet Mr Phadnis's cartoons managed to stay away from that darkness and provided pure happiness.

Editing Part IV

Editing is an important step in a documentary film, as it gives an actual shape to the film.

Reviewing captured footage, segregating it as per the content, making chunks of the same subject from differeant interviews, selecting audio tracks for diffrent situations, overlaping animation and video, these are the basic parts of editing involved in this project.

Combining Animation with video footage will be my real challenge. I will try to blend them properly to create feel of Mr. Phadnis's illustrations.

I will work on final Cut pro 6.0 for editing, and on flash for the animation.

Learnings

Documentary filmmaking has its own limitations, working within available resources, and time is challenging.

Research for the film is the base of documentary filmmaking. Quality research results in a good quality film.

Time management plays an important role film making.

The energy and enthusiasm of Mr. Phadnis, as person and as an artist inspired me to complete my project confidently.
