


After visiting the site I got a very clear idea with which they have started this project. Some of the things they say about unconditional love are very inspiring to the one who wants to work for such a cause.

"Unconditional Love? Amm... It doesn't exist!"


Best part was, I got many stories from each of them about their experiences in life.


Some of interactions include:

- I talked some of the relatives about their love towards their children, as parental love is given as the best example for unconditional love







I was very fascinated by the clay animation and I like the handmade feel it gives to the film, but it was not fixed that I will use this style only.



Data Analysis

- It is very hard to find if any act of love is an act of unconditional love or not.
- Parental love and love towards pets are the best examples of unconditional love
- It's not blind love and not self-destructive.
- Outcome of it is always positive.
- It is said that it's the most powerful practice which leads to Enlightenment...!
- It can't be boxed in words.
- The highest level of understanding and consciousness.
- It's a cure for many problems.

Preproduction - Concept

Initial Idea

The initial idea was to have a simple story with an incident/conflict where the protagonist has two options:

- The first one is "to be practical and fight with the other person"
- And the second one is "to try to see the other person as a human and act with kindness and love".

There were mainly three levels developing story ideas on unconditional love:

- Love that is without any expectations
- Love that gets positive response
- Love that gets negative response and still it is continued

After discussing with my guide, I decided to go with the third option as it will be much more effective as compared to the other two.

So then, I went on thinking about the concepts and after a lot of brainstorming I came up with three of them as follows:

Concept 1

Showing the act of conditional love along with unconditional love to underline the difference and how the later is much more effective!

Concept 2

Showing the act of unconditional love against a negative character and result of the power of unconditional love in the situation!

Concept 3

Showing an incident/conflict where protagonist fights over a small reason, result of which is worse and then taking the story back to the point where the protagonist had two ways to react & showing another simple way with act of unconditional love.

After discussing with my guide and professors, I decided to go with the second concept and I started thinking about the stories.

Preproduction - Story

Initial Story Ideas

- 1. A kid is told about the existence of God and how God loves us unconditionally... the kid experiences the power of love through some incidences... actually it's his father who is observing the kid and acting accordingly to convince him the power of unconditional love and positivity.
- 2. A busy man finds a puppy in the surrounding of his house... he is too busy to pay attention towards the puppy... sees it daily... once notices that the puppy has got injured... getting late for the office... conflict... carries the puppy to the doctor..
- 3. A plant and a kid...unconditional love of the plant...both grow ... the kid, who is now a grown up, forgets his friend tree...(Nature <---> Human or story of Earth and Human)
- 4. An imaginary world of some characters (human like)...where everybody helps each other... and there is no existence of bad things like selfishness, ego, etc.
- 5. A person (may be from another planet) always practices unconditional love)...he never has seen conditional love... comes to a world where unconditional love doesn't exist.... His practice of unconditional love is so powerful that it changes this world into the world where only unconditional love exists... showing at least a start of this change.
- 6. Story of two animals helping each other though being in danger... many times animals teaches us many things which simply show their pure hearts and their unconditional love.
- 7. A man faces a very simple problem everyday... another character notices him everyday struggling at that problem... and then he/she helps him, not letting him know... The help comes back to him in the very next moment.
- 8. A story the Heart and the Brain as two characters.

- 9. A man sees a kid selling something at signals... he approaches the kid and adopts it... he remembers himself being an orphan...
- 10. Kid afraid of a dog on the roadside ... it always barks at kid One day kid sees him shivering due to cold Kid tries to go to him but he barks Kid goes from there... at night when his papa puts blanket on him, he tells his papa about the dog... next day his papa goes and help him, feed him...Though he still barks at them they still love him... afterwards the becomes very friendly.
- 11. A poor boy in a new school... very bright... there is a group of rich boys in the school... he tries to be a friend of them, but gets humiliation...at home he tells his mom... mom tells him to still love those friends and keep his goodness always... sequence of more incidences.. Kid still keeps positive... one day he helps the rich boy in some problem... and wins everyone's heart
- 12. Old age home.... Son sends his parents to old age home... insults them... one day in the garden everyone is describing their evil sons or daughters... but this old man says all good things about his son and how he still loves his son... puts curtain on his son's rudeness... his son, who has come for some formalities, sees this... breaks into tears..

After a lot discussions and thinking, I developed rough stories from three of these ideas.

Story 1

An old man and a young boy....daily routine... meet in the bus.... Old man always makes his insult... says something about young generations.... Yell about a reserved seat... One day... bus is very crowded... boy gets a seat (unreserved).... Old man doesn't get one... He is tired... The boy gives that seat to the old man...

Story 2

An office man and an office boy....boy steals something from the man's table every day...(may be money..) man finds that someone is stealing from him... next day... he finds that it's the office boy...and why he is stealing... may be out of need... the man helps the boy in the matter.. After some days, boy returns in good clothes and mithai...he has found a good job.

Story 3

An old man is new to the area -- always screams at people -- a carpenter works nearby and lives with his family. People living around are getting sick of the old man.

Carpenter is a loving person who can see the human behind this rude person -- tries to help him again and again even though he gets back only yelling from the old man.

Still he continues showing his unconditional love towards this old man and wins his heart at the end.:)

Out of all these, I liked the third one most because I found simplicity and potential emotions in this one. After discussing the story with guide and professors, I got a nice feedback about how the characters in the story can be established more and how this story can be made more interesting and connecting story to the audience. Then I developed this story further as my final story.

Final Story

A young man who works in his small carpentry shop, near his house, always shows kindness and love towards all. He is a very positive, happy and generous man. He spreads happiness and love all around him. He believes in unconditional love. He lives in a small town with his son and wife, who many times fail to understand his unconditional love towards all.

An old man comes to the same area. He has bought a house near the carpenter's house and shop. This old man is very short tempered and a cruel man and hence, is lonely. Because of his nature, all, including his servant, run away from him. On the very first day, when he comes with all his luggage and furniture, he shouts at his servant on a small mistake, which makes him run away. All the people around are watching this and so is the carpenter. Seeing the old man struggling with moving the furniture, he tries to help him, but the old man shouts at him, too. People around him think how cruel and mad this man is. No one then tries to help the old man or interact with him. But the carpenter feels bad for him. He decides to help the man and not leave him struggling alone. He is able to see the lonely sad man behind this angry and cruel man. During next few days, many times old man shouts at carpenter on small reasons, like the noise of carpenter's machine, his pet dog and the kids playing around.

The old man has an old, antic scooter, which is very rusty and makes noise. When the old man rides it, all the people around him don't fail to comment on him and laugh at him. The man always struggles while crossing his scooter over the steps at his house gate. Carpenter sees this and tries to help him, but again gets nothing but a loud yelling by the old man. This happens again and again. The carpenter doesn't see the bad nature of the old man, but he can always see his struggle. The carpenter really wants to help him. In spite of getting all the insulting scolding and humiliation, carpenter makes a wooden ramp on the half of the steps of old man's house and when the old man sees this, he can eventually feel the kindness and love that the carpenter is showing towards him, that too after all his wrong behaviour and that causes a transformation within him. Like the carpenter he also starts spreading the happiness and love, in his own way...!!

I refined the story time to time whenever I thought any part isn't working or so and then I progressed towards making the plot of the short film and script.

Preproduction – Script

Scene 0 (Inciting incident):

A young man (35 years old) is working in his small shop of carpentry. He hears a dog's scream. It seems some vehicle has hit a dog. The man hurriedly moves outside. Sees a dog injured. He picks the dog. His son, who is playing nearby, also comes there. He exclaims, "How dirty it is!" The man kindly tells him, "He needs us right now". He takes the necessary action on dog's wounds, makes a nice house for him, and tells his kid that u should always be kind and loving in spite of the other person's or animal's condition.

Suddenly, they hear a shouting noise. An old man (60 years old), is scolding his servant, for he has dropped something on the floor. The old man seems shifting to this new house which is in front of the carpenters house and shop. Other people around him stop to see the matter. The carpenter tries to say something, but the old man is so angry that he shouts at everyone. The servant is not that kind, so he shouts back at the old man and leaves him alone with all the furniture on the road.

Scene 1 (rise of action 1):

The old man shouts at people around and tells them to mind their own businesses. He struggles in moving the furniture all alone. The carpenter is still watching him. When at the steps of the main gate, the old man couldn't carry the load and about to fall down, the carpenter rushes to help him. But unexpectedly, the old man shouts him back.

Scene 2 (rise of action 2):

On some other morning, the old man is sitting in the chair remembering of his family (son and wife celebrating his birthday in the house). He awakens by the noise of carpenter's machine. He shouts at carpenter from his window at first floor.

Another morning the old man is trying to start his old scooter, all rusty and very slow. It makes noise. The carpenter jokingly says to the old man, "Aapka scooter bhi to bahut aawaj karta hai chacha, haha" . The old man maintains his angry face and leaves.

Scene 3 (rise of action 3 and high point):

The old man always struggles with his scooter, while crossing the steps at the main gate. All people around him comment on him and laugh cruelly at him. He also shouts them back. The carpenter tries to help him again, but gets nothing other than humiliation and yelling.

At the same moment, a ball hits the old man. The kids were playing around. The man ruins the ball and shouts at them. It's the carpenter's son. Also when he sees the dog, who is now the pet of carpenter, the dog is peeing on the scooter. The old man tries to hit him hard. The carpenter saves the dog from being hit by the old man and tells his son that I will buy a new ball for you. All the people around him get shocked after seeing such cruel behaviour of the old man towards kids and little puppy.

The old man feels guilty about his behaviour. But he remembers a scene where he along with his family, has got in an accident and he is asking help, but no one helps

him and he loses his wife and son in that accident. After remembering this, he becomes angry again.

Scene 4 (main culmination/climax):

On another day (time between afternoon and evening), the old man comes pushing his scooter (which has got some problem and is not working). He seems very tired and exhausted. When he comes in front of the carpenter's shop, he actually expects the carpenter to come and help him, but he doesn't. The old man maintains his look of disgust and hate and anger. And continues pushing the scooter.

He imagines how he is gonna to deal with the steps at the gate now. (Imagination shot where he is struggling at the steps)

Suddenly, he looks at the steps and there is this wooden ramp on the half part of the steps. His face turns into a surprising one. He realizes that this must be carpenters work. He, at the moment turns towards the carpenter's shop, but... He is not there. Then he turns back with his neutral face. The carpenter is standing there, ready to hear the scolding and yelling, looking up and down.

Scene 5 (Resolution):

The old man's face turns slowly into a happy face, he starts smiling, his eyes become wet... He laughs loudly and hugs the carpenter. Carpenter starts smiling too. They are smiling and at the same moment a ball hits the old man again. He stops smiling and turns.

Now he seems angry again, all the kids run away. Some of the other people stop to see what is happening. As soon as carpenter's son trying to run then the old man stops him angrily, calls him. The son sees towards his father, comes slowly towards the old man. The old man returns him the ball. He looks up surprisingly. The old man starts laughing happily. All start smiling. The puppy also comes and starts jumping around.

During the credits, the old man is also playing with the kids and the dog...!

Preproduction – Storyboard

Based on the plot and considering the emotional graph of the film I made some changes in the plot while doing the storyboard. I developed the dialogues after a rough storyboard.

In the first boards, I went for the shot angles in which I was seeing the film in mind.

And I also made some changes time to time as per the need of the story and the script and then I made this refined version of it.

Feedback during the project-2 final presentation and decisions made on it:

I got a nice feedback during my final presentation. It included following main points:

- More involvement of kids somewhere in the middle
 - o I decided to add them at the scene where the old man is unable to push his scooter up on the steps and added a storyboard shot there as below:

- The beginning of the last scene should be very well acted and animated in order to get old man's feeling exact to what is planned.
- Change in the old man's mood, after seeing the ramp should be convincing enough.
 - o I added a shot which has similar angle as the shot where e is irritated while pushing

the scooter, and now, how happy he is while pushing it on the ramp with an ease.



I also got many suggestions on my further work with set making and claymation, like:

- Do locking for each shot in the film, decide layout and angles
- Then finalise set design once tryouts on blocking and layouts are done, you can figure out how much set, which parts are actually needed for the film. You can reuse some things like trees, portions of buildings, props
- About external rigging- how it can be used to hold the characters while animating them.
- And neck joint which should be more firm in order to hold the head properly.

All the feedback I got during the presentation was really helpful before heading towards the production.

Preproduction – Character Design

There are four main characters:

• The old man, the carpenter, his son and a puppy

- An extra man and a lady in the crowd

The old man -


He is 55-60 years old man who is and upper middle class man. He is a lonely person and has become rude and hard spoken due to some past experiences, but is much softer from inside.

Until this stage, I had decided to go for clay animation as final medium for my short film. After discussing with my guide I started experimenting with the clay and learning the medium.

Old Man in clay:



After this first trial, I started feeling the need of learning basic face sculpting. So I started watching some tutorials and after practising the face many times I got somewhat better version.





At this stage, I felt the need of trying some animation with face. The eyeballs were already movable. I tried a shot with just facial modifications and head turns.

Preproduction – Character Development

My process of making the characters

Required Material:

• Thermocol, sandpaper, medical tape, fevicol, aluminium wires of different thickness, m-seal, foam sheets, rubber solution, cloth for making cloths, beads, acrylic paints, plasticine, I-clay and various tools required for clay modeling as well as set of pliers and wire cutter, etc.



Armature

- In the beginning I drew the character on paper in exact proportions with required shapes of its head and torso.
- Then I carved out similar shaped out of a block of high density thermocol, and sanded it with a fine sand paper till its surface becomes smooth.
- After this I applied fevical on these pieces to make the surface stronger as we need to fix wire over it. Fevical also makes the surface better for the clay as clay does not stay directly on the thermocol.
- Then I joined the parts using the aluminium wire as in the images and basic armature is done.
- Then I applied m-seal at the places of the bones to make that part not bend while animating. I had used black mseal previously, which was very sticky and not proper. White m-seal is very very better for this purpose.
- After that I constructed the volume of the body part using foam sheets.
- And then stitched the clothes directly onto the character.
- I made the sweater of the old man removable as it is made up of stretchable material. If possible making of removable clothes can be beneficial in a way, as there are many scenes on various days in my film. So there should be multiple clothes or at least some different combinations should be possible. E.g. here I have made the sweater removable so that it can be used on different models of the same character or with different combinations of the clothes.
- At the end, when my full armature was ready, I sculpted the head of the character using clay. Sculpting tools are very useful for this purpose.

OLD MAN character development process:











But the puppet was not that animation friendly and there were many problems like very stiff joints, m-seal part was very hard and was restricting the proper movement. Also the head was fixed on the body, so it was very difficult for animating the expressions and lip-syncing.

So I made an another improved version of the old man character, with removable head and this time I used white m-seal, which was quite neat and clean and did not make the puppet extra hard.

And above is the body with arrangement for the removable head. I used a hollow steel pipe for making the cavity for neck.

I took help from my sister and my father for stitching the clothes for the puppets.

For hand and fingers, I used 0.3mm (thin) aluminium wire, wrapped t with thin foam sheet and then covered it with clay.



Camera blocking and angles

As my guide had suggested me, after the project2 and before heading towards the set making, I started doing the blocking for each shot in the film.

I used simple boxes and carton sheets for blocking.





Along with camera blocking, I also tried to get the expressions and body language of the character for each shot.

Here are some of the frames from blocking animatic along with the previous frame for the same shot:













































Blocking of the shots helped me in many ways like:

- First of all, I could decide and fix the camera angles.
- I got an idea of the scale of the set and properties according to puppets' interaction with them.
- As I said earlier, I already tried the characters' body language and expressions for each shot. So it became easier while actually shooting that shot.
- I could divide the whole set into subsets according to what part is required for each shot and which shots I can with that particular set once I set it.
- External supports and rig while setting the body language I got to know the extent to which the characters will move in the shot and how I can support it externally.

Then I added all the blocking frames n the animatic and made the blocking animatic. I started making the set after finishing the blocking animatic.

I used a basic shaped thermocoal scooter for blocking but I faced some balancing problems with it. I made it using mdf sheet and added the mechanism of rotating the handle and the wheels which are useful while animating it.





And also it became quite strong to bear the weight of the puppet.
