From next day onwards the workshop started. I purchased the drawing materials from the town.

3 weeks of workshop

At the beginning I had the tendency of judging children's drawings. But after hearing some of it Jinan sir said don't come to conclusions at this stage. It is too early. Just observe, what the children are doing and learn from them. We are conducting this workshop to learn from the children. The children might not get anything from us! Don't give advise or guidance. Let them draw.










Workshops samples


At the beginning children drew objects like house, trees, flowers etc. What ever is familiar with them. Some of them drew peacocks. That bird was familiar to them.









Then we slowly introduced real life objects and sometimes asked them to draw from their memory.







It is a very short time period to observe and coming up with a conclusion. Jinan sir told me it will take some months to see some patterns in their drawing.


Also I was lucky enough to read his rough draft of the book- 'Seeing through Hands!'


In that book he has observed some of the common patterns in children's drawings.


After the workshop, I went back home and helped him for his book. I have done the colour correction and clean up of the drawings. Also done a rough compilation for the book.



'Trees' I wouldn't have drawn without this workshop











Some thoughts from Jinan sir


- Human being should learn to represent their observations through drawings rather than writing.
 We should start using drawing as a cognitive tool rather than writing.
- There is nothing wrong with the bad drawing. Like writing, drawing also will take time to learn.
- •There is no deep meaning in art. It is just the appreciation of beauty. It is like a flower blooming.
 Art shouldn't be constructed.
- •Writing is only a documentation tool. Don't depend on it for knowledge. Knowledge comes from the world around us.







