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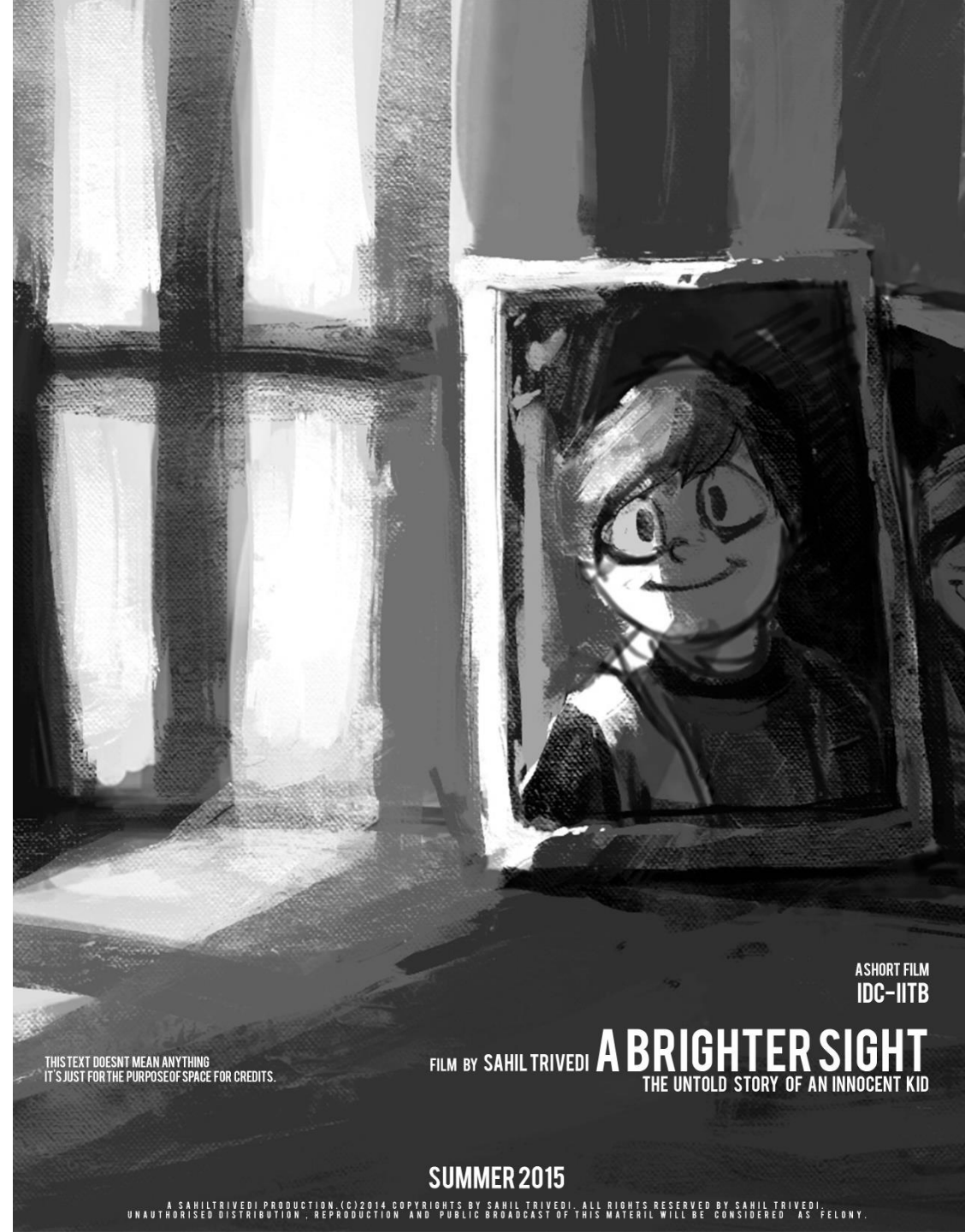


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

 - ▶ Inappropriate sexual comments
 - ▶ Taunting
 - ▶ Threatening to cause harm
- ▶ Social bullying, sometimes referred to as relational bullying, involves hurting someone's reputation or relationships. Social bullying includes:
 - ▶ Leaving someone out on purpose
 - ▶ Telling other children not to be friends with someone
 - ▶ Spreading rumors about someone
 - ▶ Embarrassing someone in public
- ▶ Physical bullying involves hurting a person's body or possessions. Physical bullying includes:
 - ▶ Hitting/kicking/pinching
 - ▶ Spitting
 - ▶ Tripping/pushing
 - ▶ Taking or breaking someone's things
 - ▶ Making mean or rude hand gestures

Early Childhood

Early childhood often marks the first opportunity for young children to interact with each other. Between the ages of 3 and 5, kids are learning how to get along with each other, cooperate, share, and understand their feelings. Young children may be aggressive and act out when they are angry or don't get what they want, but this is not bullying. Still, there are ways to help children.

Helping Young Children Get Along with Others

Parents, school staff, and other adults can help young children develop skills for getting along with others in age-appropriate ways.

- ▶ Model positive ways for young children to make friends. For example, practice pleasant ways that children can ask to join others in play and take turns in games. Coach older children to help reinforce these behaviors as well. Praise children for appropriate behavior. Help young children understand what behaviors are friendly.
- ▶ Help young children learn the consequences of certain actions in terms they can understand. For example, say "if you don't share, other children may not want to play with you." Encourage young children to tell an adult if they are treated in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable, upset or unhappy, or if they witness other children being harmed.
- ▶ Set clear rules for behavior and monitor children's interactions carefully. Step in quickly to stop aggressive behavior or redirect it before it occurs.
- ▶ Use age-appropriate consequences for aggressive behavior. Young children should be encouraged to say "I'm sorry" whenever they hurt a peer, even accidentally. The apology should also be paired with an action. For example, young children could help rebuild a knocked over block structure or replace a torn paper or crayons with new ones.



Children who are bullied could experience the effects long into adulthood, a recent study has shown. Conducted by a research team led by professor Dieter Wolke of the University of Warwick and William E Copeland of Duke University Medical Centre, the study assessed 1,420 participants four to six times between the ages of 9 and 16 years and adult outcomes between 24-26 years of age.

The results show that people who were bullied as children were twice as likely to have difficulty in keeping a job in adulthood, while many showed signs of having difficulty in forming social relationships. One group in particular – the bully-victims – so named because to identify people who turned to bullying after being bullied themselves, are allegedly the most vulnerable. They are at greatest risk for health problems in

At his new school, every day, seven-year-old Chirag of Pune was openly taunted, just because he spoke with a foreign accent, since he and his family had just relocated from abroad. Since he was also hyperactive, he'd become inattentive in class, which made matters worse. Other children nicknamed him Dopey. Once an enthusiastic swimmer, Chirag started to skip the sessions—something the school's coach noticed and discovered, after some prodding, the bullying Chirag was subjected to.

The coach discussed this with Chirag's father, who revealed that the boy's school attendance too had become irregular because of "stomach pains" that he had likely been feigning.

The bell rang. The children packed their bags and rushed out of their classrooms. Just then somebody in the school bus noticed that Rahul, a fifth-standard boy, was missing. Actually, Rahul hadn't been seen since the mid-day recess. Later, after a frantic search by many, the janitor found the terrified boy locked in a toilet.

For months Rahul had been taunted and teased by a classmate who shared his desk—for being a "favourite" of their teacher. It was traumatic for the boy, whose parents wondered why their son woke up crying at night and sometimes refused to attend school, although he was good at studies.

Indeed Rahul's good grades and ability to make friends only added to the problem. On occasions, his books had been stolen, ripped and returned.

Today, things had gone too far. "I'll teach you a lesson," his desk partner had told Rahul earlier in the day, after falsely accusing him of stealing his textbook. During recess, the bully saw an opportunity and bolted Rahul in the toilet, where he'd spent more than two hours waiting for help.

After Rahul's parents learnt of his ordeal, a teacher spoke to the other boy, who was persuaded to explain his

behaviour. "My mother locks me in the toilet as punishment," he said. Following that, counselling sessions, which involved a teacher, both boys and their parents, brought peace between the boys, who are now friends. [Rahul has returned to his normal, happy self.]

groups and Facebook social media website Therefore I was getting clear with some point of view to how to deal with the story for my film.

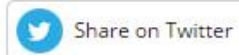
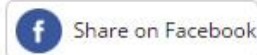

The problem of cyber bullying amongst school students in India: The loopholes in IT Act

by Debarati Halder* and K. Jaishankar**

Introduction

Bullying classmates, juniors or even seniors in the school is a common culture among the young school students in India. Mostly it is unprovoked teasing which in some circumstances turn as unintentional abuse of power by one or more children in order to inflict pain or cause distress to another child on repeated occasions. It is a common form of child abuse (Dawkins J, Hill P. Bullying: Another form of abuse?). Bullying in a broader sense also includes cyber bullying through internet and mobile phones. While simple teasing regarding one's personal habits, figure, or any other object which generates curiosity in the young minds is not gravely harmful, but when the same verbal remarks make a child suffer deep depression, withdrawal symptoms or even affect his studies, the seriousness of the issue does not remain bounded in only “just for fun sake”. With the easy access to mobile phones and internet by the school students, the matter becomes more serious as the identity of the victim may be revealed to a bigger circle. It is however, a very much neglected fact that the habit of bullying and cyber bullying in schools open the path way for the offender to become a habitual ragger in colleges and even turn him into a cyber criminal.

Unfortunately, such an important issue has been totally overlooked by the legislators while promulgating cyber law. Even though with the establishment of IT Act, Indian Penal code, Indian Evidence Act, The Banker's Books Evidence Act and the Reserve bank of India Act have been amended, Juvenile Justice Act has not been touched upon. It is a hard truth that cyber crime affects children to a greatest extent and in modern India they are practically left defenseless in cyber world. Further in India there is no school manual, guidelines or uniform regulations to prevent bullying or cyber bullying and unfortunately neither the IT Act, 2000, nor the Juvenile Justice Act deals with such subjects of cyber bullying.

Why there should be a law addressing cyber bullying in the schools?... is a question which we have faced from many school teachers, educationists, parents and managements and even students of elite schools. The correspondent of Pushpalatha Matriculation Higher Secondary School, Triunelveli, an elite school from south Tamil Nadu regretted on the fact that there is no uniform school regulations or policy guidelines banning general bullying, usage of cell phones or restricting internet visits inside the school premises. Even though some schools in metro cities have banned mobile phones inside the schools, stray incidents of sending offending messages to the fellow students through mobile phones still happen and it is growing in number. Similarly, bullying through internet is a common fashion amongst school students.

The most disturbing point in this case is the age group of such offenders range from 8 to 18. Hence either they do the crime of cyber bullying unknowingly, or they do the offence

Regulations should be made for each school to have a counselor who can address the cyber crime related issues as well.

The need of the day is cyber savvy judges and cyber help line cells for children.

The IT Act 2000 does not mention any specific provision for safeguarding the children.

Conclusion:

Due to rapid globalization, cheap mobile phones, easy access to internet and virtually no law to stop abusing school children by their fellow classmates, the problem of cyber crime among children and young adults are on the high. In the western society, even schools are brought under strict vigil of law and administration. Cyber crime, cyber bullying may be common issues in western countries but laws are being made constantly to prevent the growing number of such crimes. India lacks the legal infrastructure to combat the core issues of cyber crimes. Children are the softest targets of the perilous effects of electronic media. Traditionally, in India, it is not the parents but the schools which play a major part to mend a child. Hence stricter laws should be made to prevent school bullying and for ensuring the safety of school children in the cyber world.

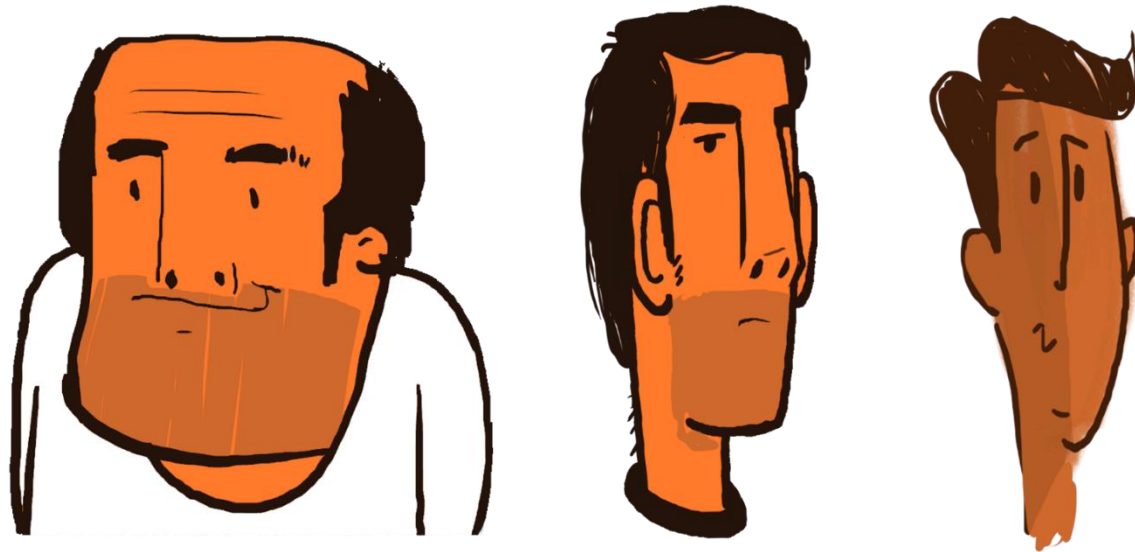

The more I will be doing all these kinds of practice the more I will be very much clear about the performance in real-time. I have tried to work on such narration as well just to get and idea out of it.



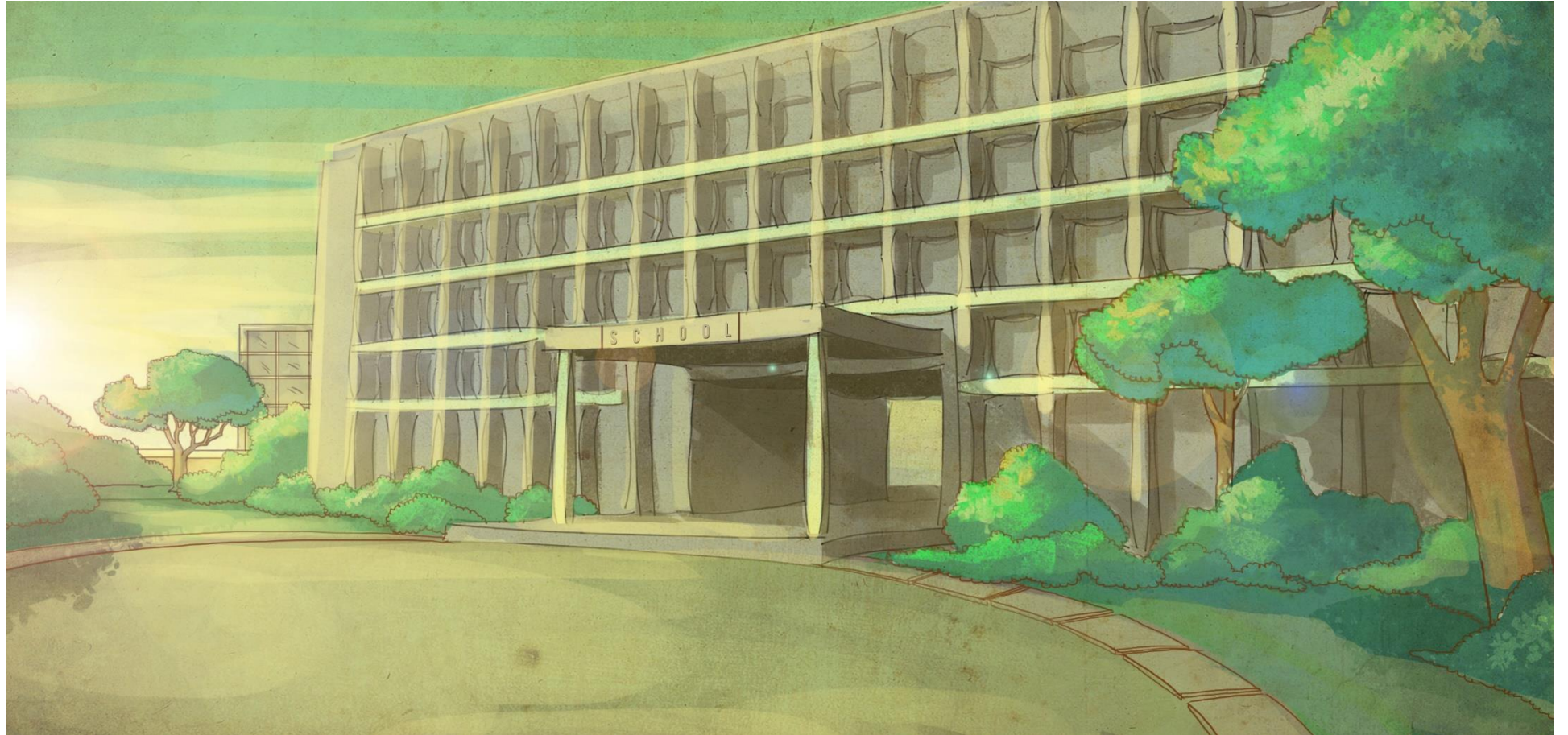

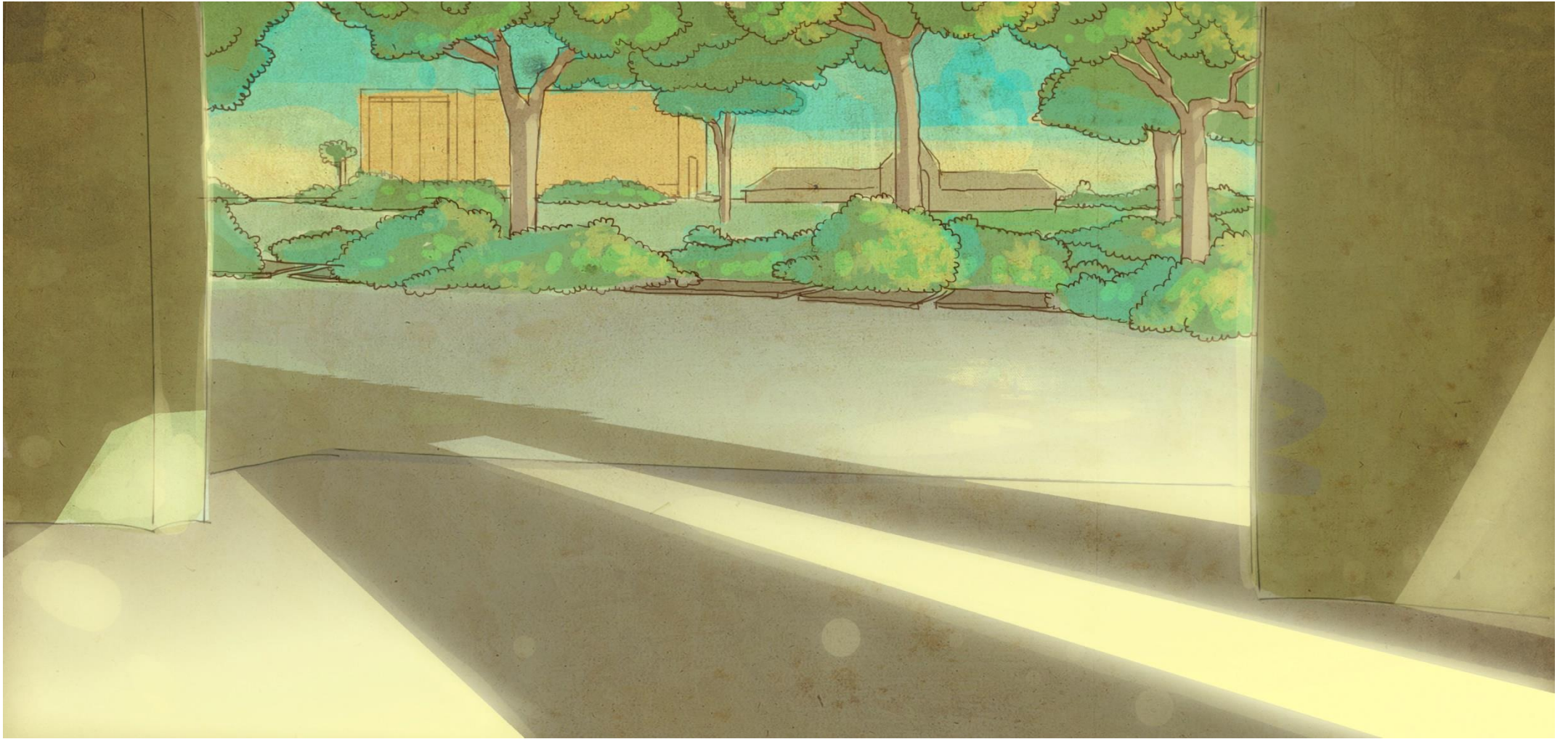

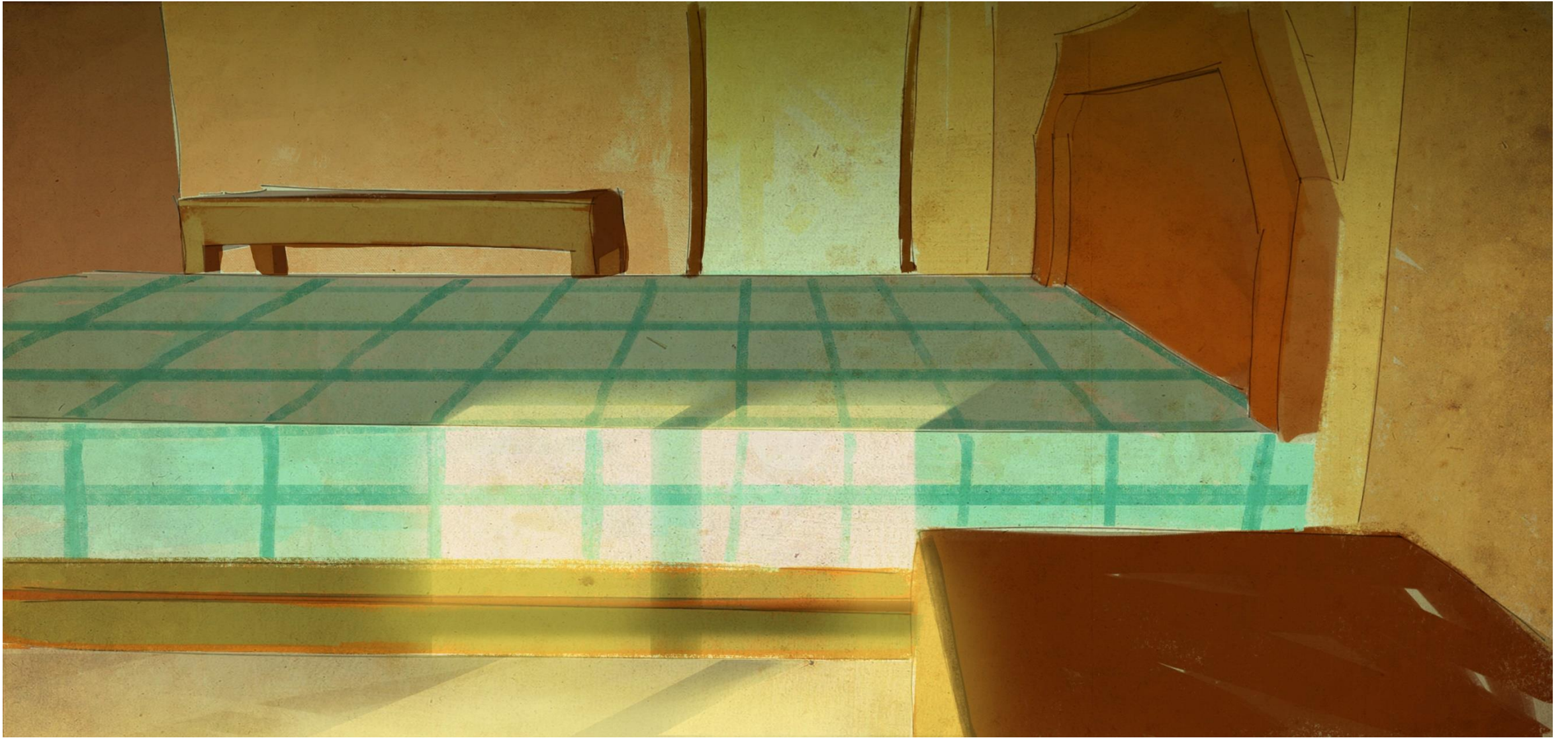


With the help of 3D I have created such base models and with help of Photoshop I have digitally painted out the exported images.

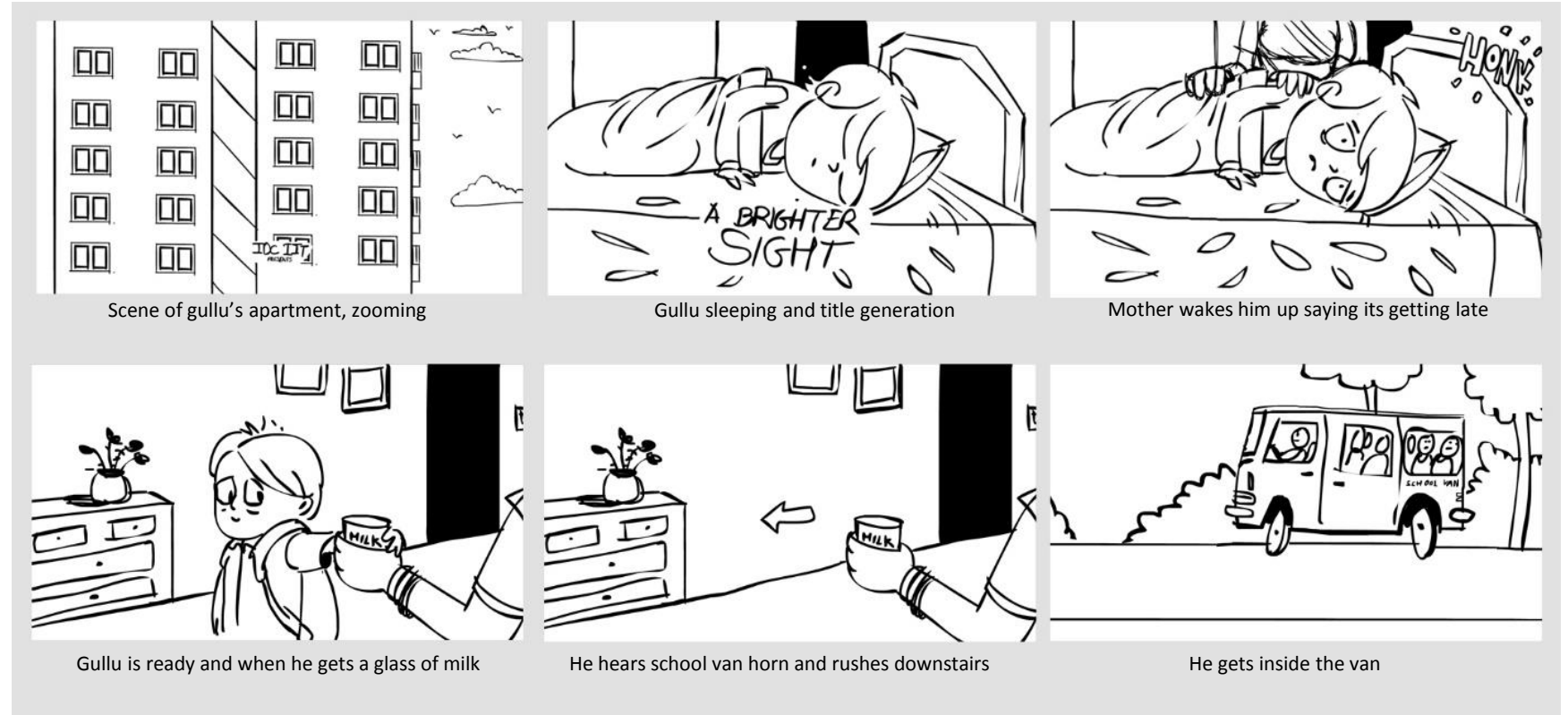




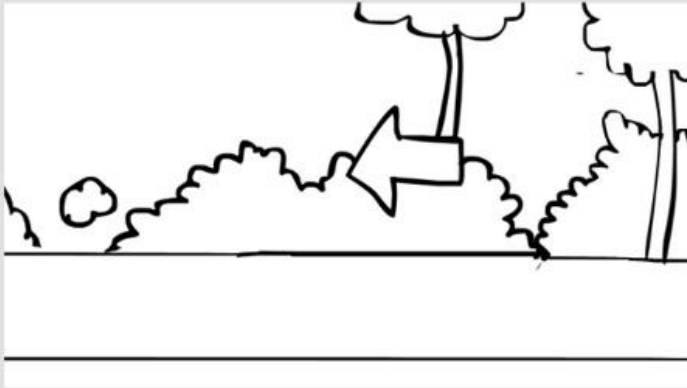
Storyboard
