Introduction

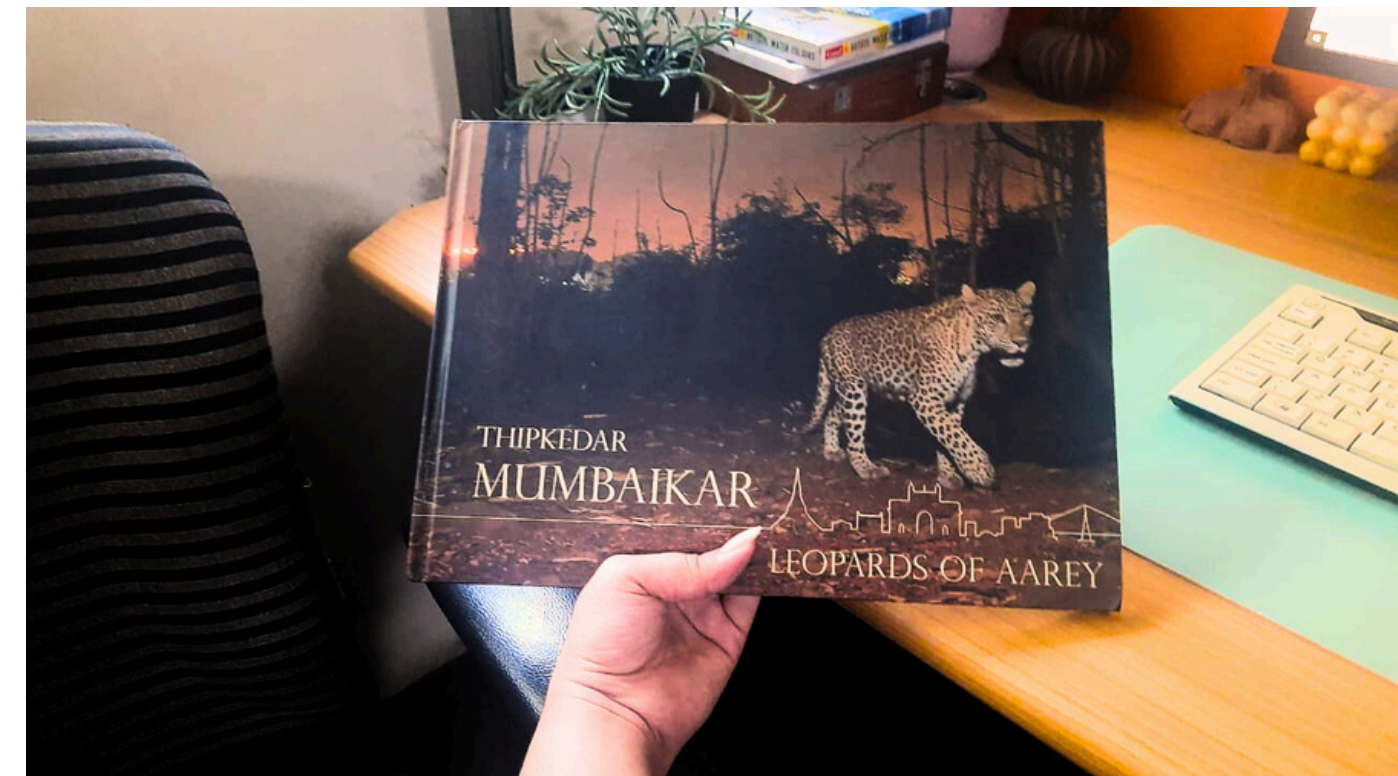

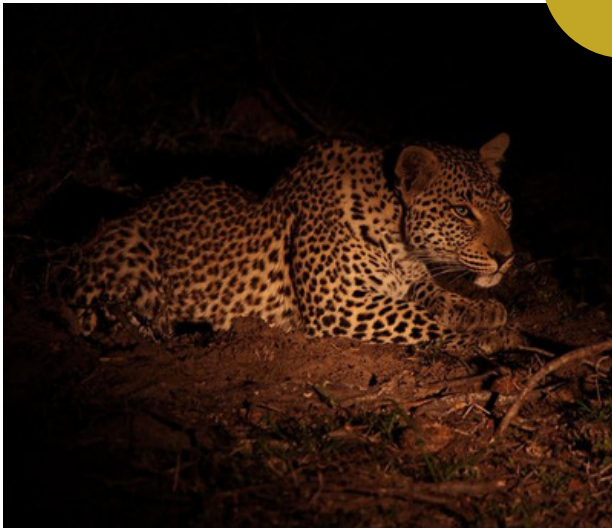
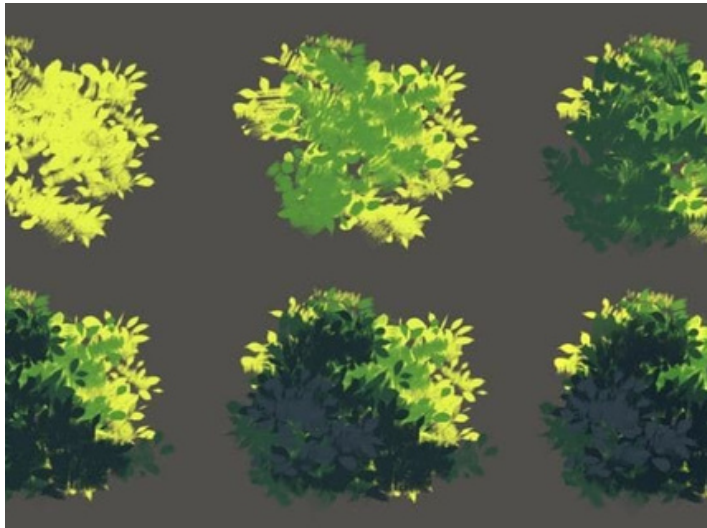
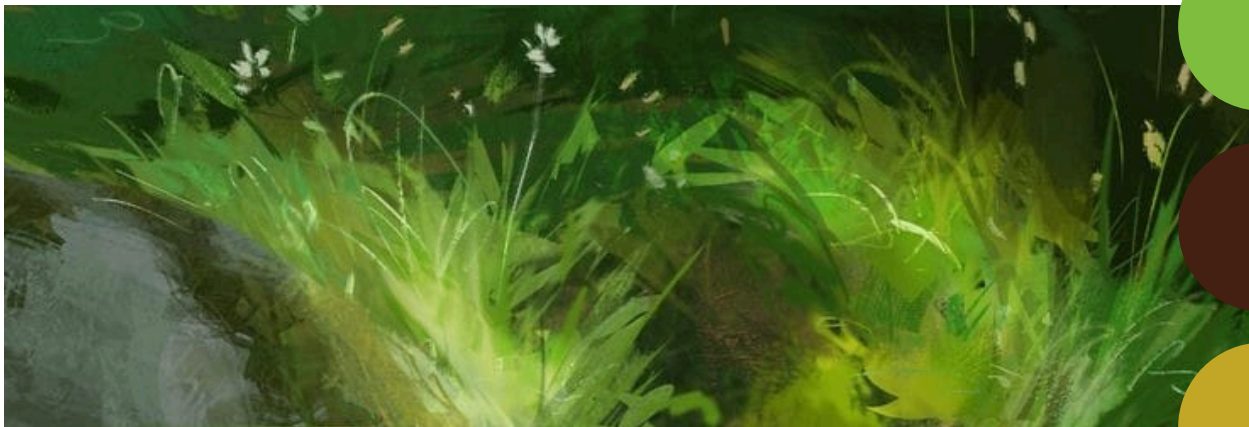
Research

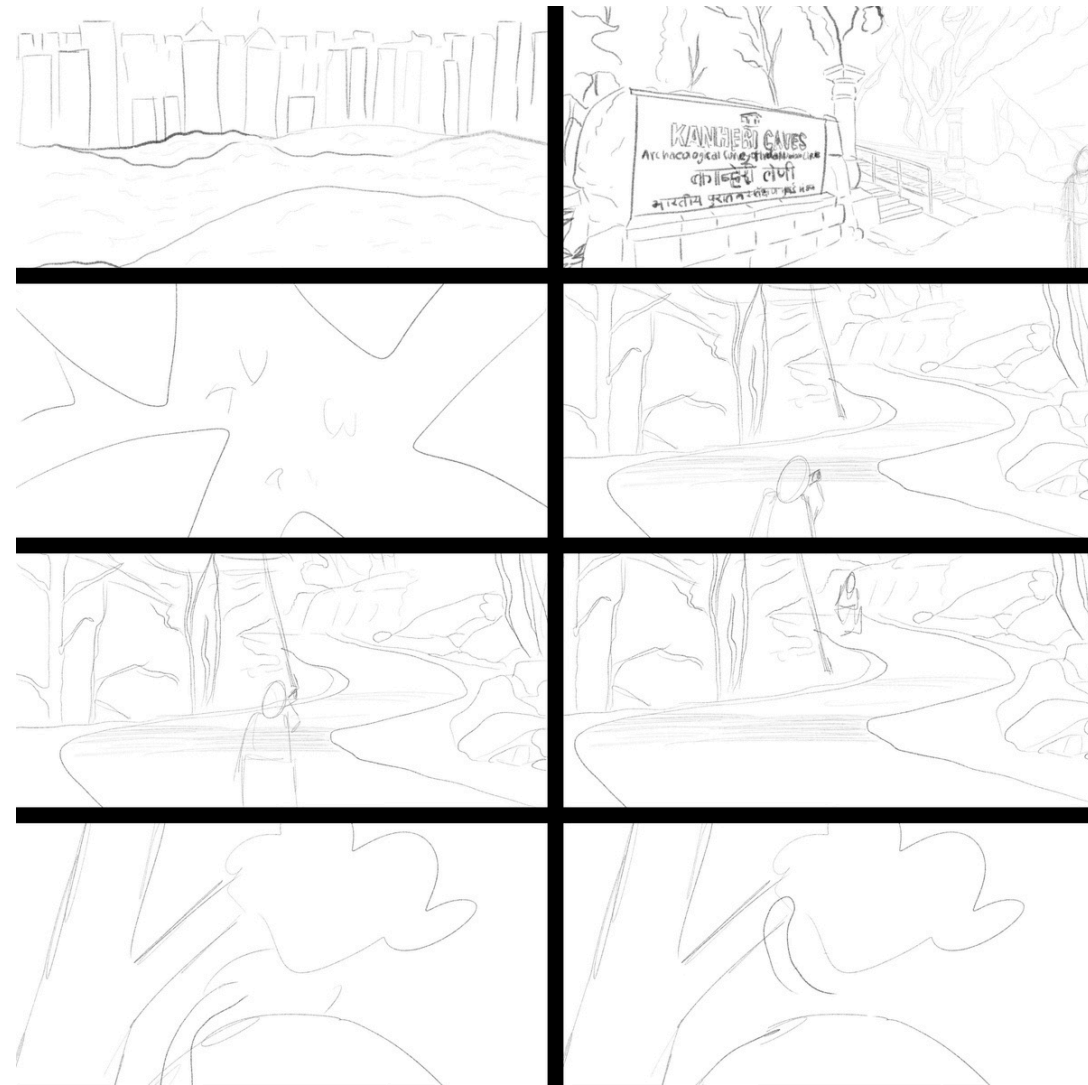

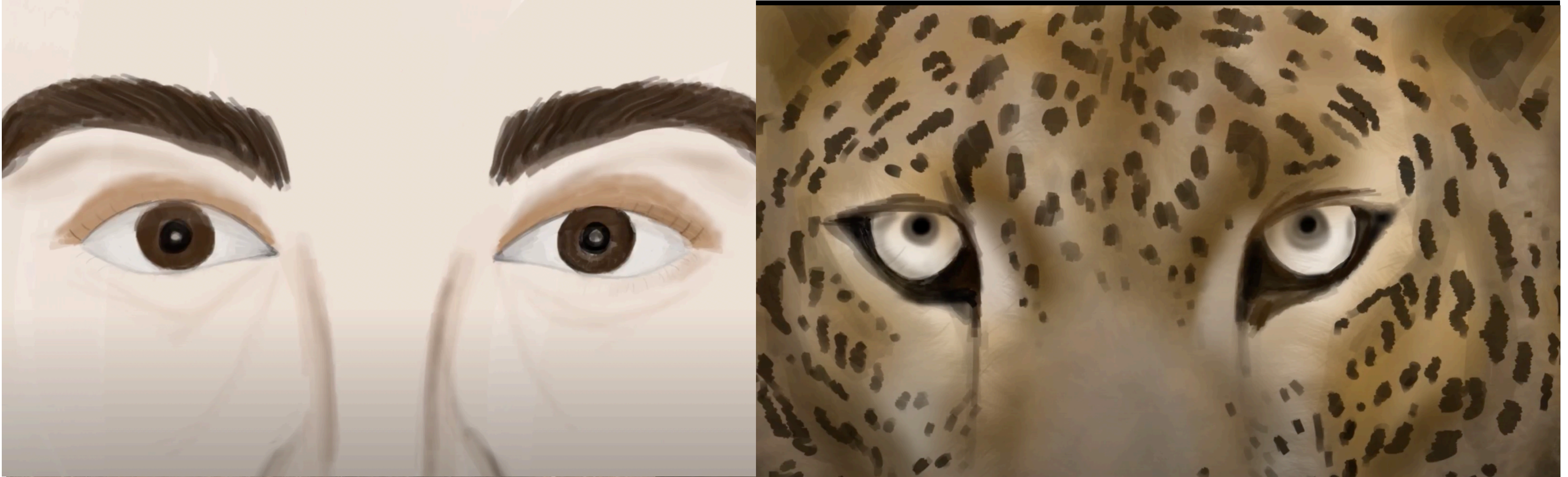
