



AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:


- Improvement in the existing product designs of handicrafts sector and introduction of same in sector.




- -- To product publicity campaigns, organise seminars and debate with experts of handicrafts sector and allied products.

Every part of the world has played a very significant role each to enrich the treasure house of art in different eras. One is the Orient, which includes India, China, Japan and Persia, another Asia Minor and Mediterranean which includes Egypt, Semitic, Byzantine, the Mohammedan, the Coptic and the Hellenistic. Then there is the Euro American beginning with the spread of classical art in Europe and the Columbian era.

Art and craft in their truest sense express the thought and feeling in harmony with their own conditions. The climate, the landscape, the flora and fauna all feed the artistic impulse and the perception of beauty.



It is natural that craft articles are made from long back to this day with the material available around the craftsman. Those who live amidst cane and bamboo make articles with them to meet most of their needs. The man of grassy plain uses grass in much of his work. The man who lives in wood conveniently uses wood.

In India, the art of the Greeks, the Kushans, the Moghuls all fused with the classical art.

The modern man lives in a mechanised society. He is tired of this complex and busy world. He finds in these productions of rural art a freshness and simplicity. He discovers in them a directness of vision and honesty of purpose. These handiworks can give him abundantly a spiritual refreshment and artistic recreation. Undoubtedly, it is due to this, that very recently handicrafts have begun to enjoy popularity throughout the world.

THE DECLINE OF HANDICRAFTS

The divorce of industry from art was a cause of universal application for the decline of handicrafts in all countries. In modern times, when art was sifted out from industry, handicrafts were forced to slide down. This separation marks the beginning of the fall of handicrafts and the beginning of the rise of mechanised industries. But when and how this process of separation began in India has to engage our attention.



THE ROLE OF HANDICRAFTS

Craft takes both the craftsman and the consumer of his product to a sphere higher to that of the mechanical world where pleasant labour makes a happy life. Through this happy intermingling of life and work, he wipes out all social tensions and in an atmosphere free of all restrictions a nation attains all-round prosperity.

ENDURING CRITERIA

To develop an appreciation for craft objects that deserve this kind of recognition, it is 3)Creative originality important to evaluate them in terms of some criteria that are fundamental in the appraisal of the visual arts in general.

- 1) Respect for material
- 2) Suitability for purpose
- 3) Creative originality
- 4) Aesthetic design

1) Respect for material

This can best be judged by the extent to which form and structure of the object reveal the inherent qualities and characteristics of the material. The primary concern is with honesty and sincerity in contrast to imitative deception or concealment.

2) Suitability for purpose

The suitability of a craft object for its purpose is largely determined by its practical usability. However, its functional quality is not necessarily dependent on long-lasting durability. Rather, the quality of the design depends on how effectively the craft object functions for its intended role.


Creative originality derives from imaginative and inventive thinking. It is characterised by willingness to abandon orthodox methods in favour of new and untried possibilities. In evaluating a craft object for its creative originality, it is helpful to consider the extent of deviation from the usual types of structures.


4) Aesthetic design

Aesthetic design is concerned with the visual organisation of all the component parts of an object. While the emphasis is on the look of the object in contrast to its utility, the quality of the design depends on a unified relationship between them.

TYPES OF WOODS SUITABLE FOR CRAFTS

Domestic woods such as redwood, pine, fir, cedar, balsam, basswood, cypress, walnut, cherry, apple and other fruit woods are very versatile for many craft purposes. Imported woods such as mahogany, ebony, rosewood and teakwood are more suitable for small craft objects and jewellery.





